Suspected Childhood Apraxia of Speech and Early Intervention

COURSE SUMMARY:

Childhood apraxia of speech (CAS) is a neurological speech sound disorder that can be challenging to assess, diagnose, and treat in minimally verbal toddlers. This course will provide an overview of evidence-based strategies for addressing suspected CAS in early intervention, emphasizing the importance of parent coaching.
