She practiced for several years in the Chicago area including Rush University Medical Center, where she was a Senior Speech Language Pathologist and Associate Faculty member of the Communication Disorders program. She specializes in adult acquired populations with an emphasis on total laryngectomy voice restoration, dysphagia, and head and neck cancer populations in all levels of care. Ms. Poole has extensive experience in clinical training and professional education and is currently working at the Queen's Head and Neck Institute in Honolulu, HI. She is also a consultant for the Blom-Singer line of voice prosthesis with InHealth Technologies.

Course Description

Head and neck cancer and treatment often impacts both speech and swallow functions. Evaluation and treatment considerations for this population can make management interesting and challenging for Speech-Language Pathologists (SLP). Speech and swallowing from early assessment, post treatment, and through survivorship will be addressed considering the location of tumor and medical treatments.
