Achieving Optimal Outcomes in Childhood Apraxia of Speech

COURSE SUMMARY:

Childhood Apraxia of Speech (CAS) is a complex disorder that can be difficult to diagnose and even more difficult to treat. In addition, CAS is rarely a stand-alone diagnosis. Research is finding that comorbid conditions are more common than once previously known, making diagnosis and treatment that much more complex. This presentation will describe how to assess a child with CAS, and more importantly how to use that assessment data to inform treatment goals. A brief overview of the core principles of motor learning and its relationship to CAS will be presented and how to incorporate them into therapy activities designed to enhance repetitive practice. Common comorbidities related to CAS will also be described.
